## WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE CMS PROGRAM?

Children and youth, birth to 21st birthday, who

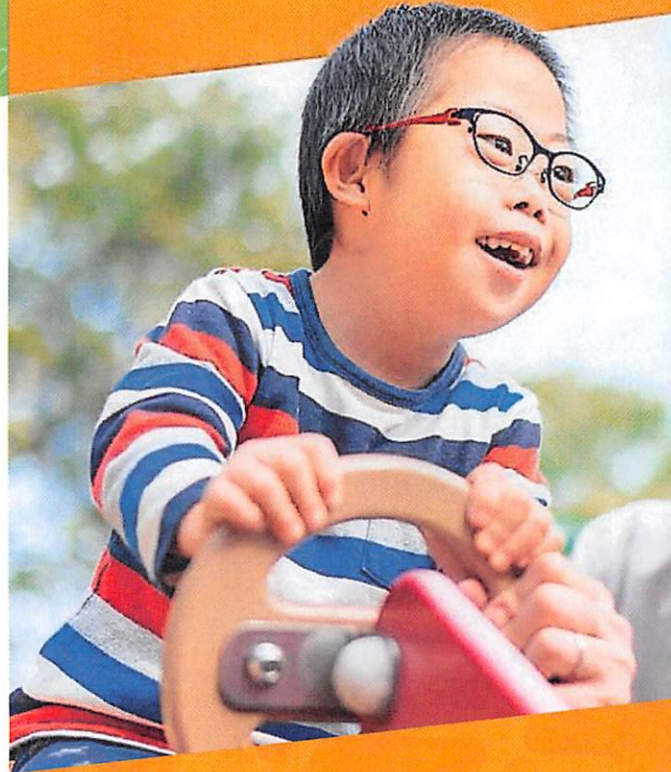
- Have a chronic medical condition including but not limited to asthma, cystic fibrosis, diabetes, Down syndrome, epilepsy, hearing loss, spina bifida or sickle cell
- Live in Georgia
- Meet income requirements

## IS THERE A COST FOR SERVICES PROVIDED BY CMS?

There is no cost to the family for services provided.

- Durable medical equipment
- Genetic counseling
